If elected, he’s looking forward to making sure Jarvis Brook isn’t ignored at the Town Council.

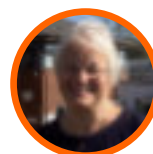

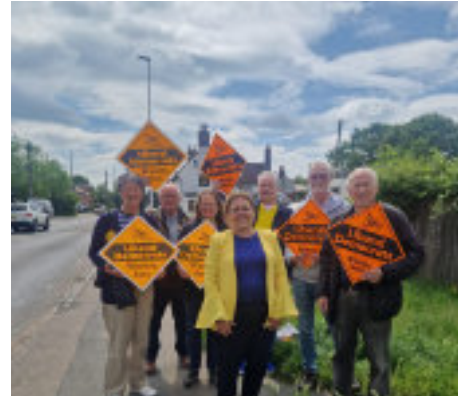
Crowborough Farmers' Market is a success story and we're proud to support it.
